Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

- The minutes of the meeting of Senate held on 27.1.06 were confirmed.
- 2. The Senate considered and approved the recommendations of the Committee of all heads, all DPGC, Chairman SPGC, Dean (S.A.) and Dean (Academic Affairs) held on 24.2.2006, in connection of payment of scholarship to students getting X-grades. (Refer Annexure –1).
- 3. The Senate considered and approved the reports of examiners for the award of Ph.D. degree to Mr. Sanjay Kumar Jain (Reg. No. 2004RCS04).
- 4. The Senate considered the examiners reports of Ph.D. candidate Mr. Chiranjeev Kumar (Enrollment No. 99AU/408) and recommended for award of Ph.D. of the University of Allahabad, as he is registered for Ph.D. in that University.
- The Senate considered the examiners reports of Ph.D. candidate Mr. Manish Rai (Enrollment No. MM/853) and recommended for award of Ph.D. of the University of Allahabad, as he is registered for Ph.D. in that University.
- The Senate considered the recommendations of the committee constituted by the Senate in its meeting held on 27.1.06 to consider the mercy appeal of students. The Senate approved the recommendations after making some modifications and the final decisions on mercy appeals is given as Annexure-2.
- 7. The Senate considered and approved the working rules (route) to be followed on the applications of P.G. students (Annexure-3). The proforma for submission of Ph.D. thesis was also approved.
- 8. The Senate considered the request of Mr. Vinay Kumar Rai a handicapped student of B.Tech.(I.T.) Semester-II (Enrollment No. 20058052) for allowing him ½ hour extra time for writing the examination. The senate opined that sufficient information is required about norms in this regard before taking such a decision. Hence, the decision was deferred.

- 13. The Senate was informed that the credit in the subject HS501/601 "Principles of Management", should be 4(3+1+1) in all the branches of B.Tech. V/VI semester. The Senate agreed.
- 14. The suggestion of Prof. B.D. Chaudhary that all the approvals accorded by the Chairman Senate should be communicated in the next meeting of the Senate was noted for future purpose if any.
- 15. The Senate reckoned that the Prof. Mahesh Chandra is scheduled to retire on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2006. The Senate appreciated the contributions of Dr. Mahesh Chandra who has served the institution in various capacities including Member B.O.G.

## Following decision were recommended to the Senate for approval:

- 1. The issue of non-payment of scholarship to M.Tech. students who got X grade in III semester was discussed and it was decided that if a student gets three or more X or his/her CPI falls below 6.0 in 3<sup>rd</sup> semester, he/she shall not be eligible for scholarship in 4<sup>th</sup> semester. This is consistent with institute P.G. manual and also with AICTE guidelines.
- 2. All Courses in which there is no class work and are evaluated on the basis of presentation by the student, will be evaluated by awarding S or X grades.
- 3. All Courses as mentioned in item 2 should have credits in multiple of 4, as one S or one X represents 4 credit equivalent.

(Rakesh Mathur) Dean (Academic Affairs) Recommendations of the Committee constituted in Senate meeting held on 27.1.06 on the mercy appeal of UG & PG students.

- 1. Mr. Bipin Gautam (Reg. No. 2002814), B.Tech. (I.T.) has cleared first and second semesters. In third semester his SPI is 2.56. Committee considered this as very poor performance & therefore recommends that he may be allowed to take readmission in third semester in July 2006. His old third semester score may be treated as cancelled. He should pass the B.Tech. degree by 2009.
- 2. Mr. Ravi Prakash (Reg. No. 20001849) B.Tech. (I.T. has two back papers in third semester and the committee recommends that in summer semester 2006, he may be allowed to clear these two subjects and may be permitted to register in fourth semester in December 2006. Since he was admitted in 2001 & cannot pass in seven years & therefore he may be allowed to continue the course up to 2009. No further extension will be given to him.
- 3. Mr. Amit Kumar (Reg.No. 2005CA22) student of MCA has got SPI/CPI in first semester 4.9/4.9 & the requirement is 5.0. The committee recommends that he may be allowed to take readmission in July 2006 & start first year a fresh.
- 4. The matter on one M.Tech. (Production) student Mr. Alok Singh Meher (Reg. No. 2003PR15) was examined & it was found that his CPI is less than 6.0 & he was registered in forth semester & continued thesis work but was not allowed defense of thesis because his CPI was less than 6.0 which is minimum required. The committee recommends that he should register for one course in July 2006 to makeup his CPI to 6.0. This subject should be a substitute of some subject in which he got minimum grade. Further committee has allowed to submit his thesis by January 2007.

- 3. For issuing the termination letters to P.G. students following steps should be followed:
  - Dean (Academic Affairs) will send a copy of result to all the HOD concerned.
  - HOD will pass on the result to Convenor DPGC of the Department.
  - Chairman SPGC will convene a meeting of SPGC to discuss and decide the cases to be terminated.
  - HOD will issue termination letters (Notification) as per recommendations of SPGC, with a copy to Dean (Acad.), Dean (S.A.) Chief Proctor, Chief Warden.

All the above procedure should be completed within a week of declaration of results.

The meeting was adjourned.
